Russell Rosengart Appointed by Lt. Governor Burt Jones to Georgia's Judicial Qualifications Commission Investigative Panel

Atlanta, July 24, 2026 – The Investigative Panel of the Judicial Qualifications Commission (“JQC”) today announces that on July 7, 2026, Russell Rosengart of Statesboro, Georgia, was appointed to the Panel by Lt. Governor Burt Jones. Rosengart’s appointment as a citizen member is for a full four-year term, which began on the date of the Lt. Governor’s appointment and ends on June 30, 2030. He succeeds long-time citizen member

Warren Selby, who had served on the Panel since the Commission’s reconstitution in 2017.

Born and raised in Statesboro, Rosengart’s family is deeply tied to the area through their ongoing work in local business and charitable causes. Following his parents’ path, Rosengart is a career businessman who has run restaurants and other companies in Georgia and South Carolina. In his free time, Rosengart gives back to his community and has served as the President of the Boys and Girls Club of Bulloch County, a member of the Statesboro Planning and Zoning Commission, a board member of the Statesboro-Bulloch County Chamber of Commerce, and the President of the Ogeechee Technical College Foundation board.

JQC Director Courtney Veal welcomed Rosengart to the Investigative Panel, noting that his extensive business and public service experience brings valuable perspective to the Commission’s important work.

Regarding his appointment, Rosengart stated he is honored to join the Commission, noting that “our judicial system must stand as a pillar of fairness, integrity and accountability.” With that goal in mind, he looks forward to contributing to the JQC’s mission.
